Maren Krings' debut book, H is for Hemp is a firsthand account of the world's applications of Hemp. The German environmental photographer was living out of her car in the late 2010s, trying to reduce her ecological footprint, when she began a four-year mission toward canna-consciousness. Taking advantage of her time on the road, Krings launched into an extensive investigation to find where and how hemp is being used today. Starting in Italy, she then ventured to 26 countries, including Russia and Turkey, and spoke with over eighty hemp-industry experts. Maren Krings had photographed over 200 hemp-related projects across the world by 2019 while keeping a personal diary.

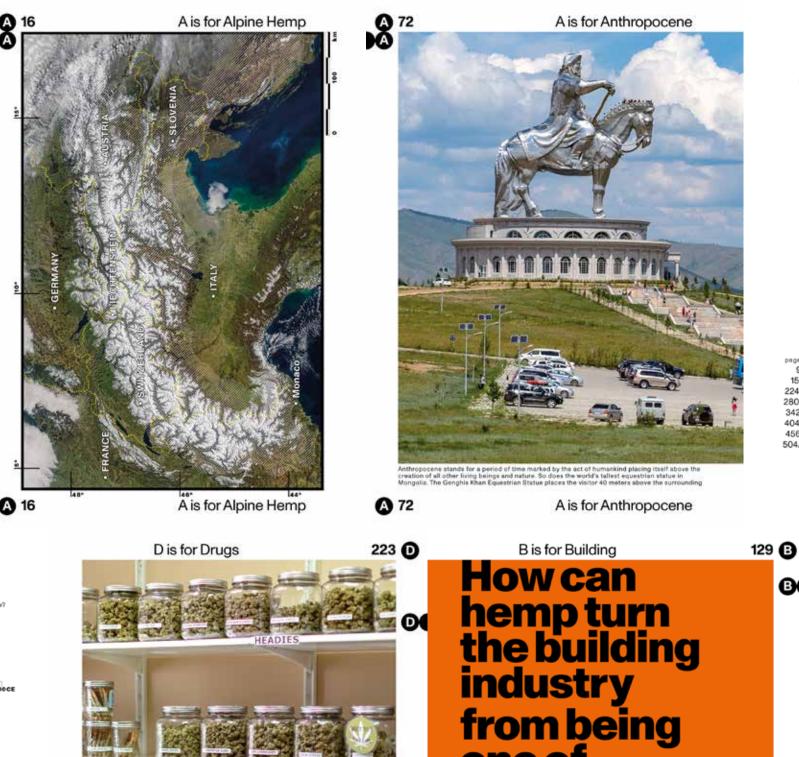

> Legal issues make it almost impossible to talk with someone from the hemp industry about its nutritional value. E is for Experts IN YOUR VIEW, WHAT MAKES HEMP SO HEALTHY? The fruit of the hemp plant is

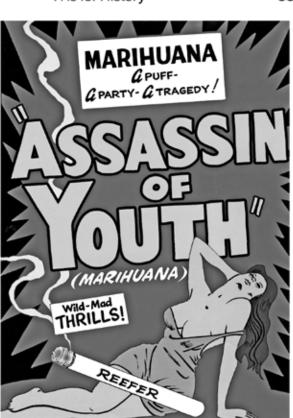
biologically a nut, but we refer to it as a seed because of its size. The hemp seeds, as all other seeds, contain protein and fatty acids, which are extremely healthy for the human body. In total there are eight amino acids, all essential to the functioning of our bodies. We must eat them: it is not optional. All eight essential amino acids are found in hemp, which makes it such a high value protein: One plant can cover everything our body needs. Then there are fats. Fats can be classified into omega 3, 6 and 9. The omega-3 fatty acids, allow our bodies to produce acids that are needed for the good functioning of our body. The A-linolenic acid (ALA) is found only in hemp and in fish oils, but because of ocean pollution, fish oils can also carry more risk.

CAN'T YOU FIND OMEGA FATS IN OTHER FOODS LIKE SUNFLOWER OIL?

All three omegas are polyunsatu-rated fatty acids and normally good for the human body. Yet in countries like Germany, Austria and Switzer-land the intake of these fatty acids comes mostly from sunflower oil, which is rich in omega 6. It is safe to say that omega 6 raises inflamma-tion levels in our body. Omega 3 on the other hand lowers this inflammatory process. To put it sim-ply, eating too much omega 6 prevents omega 3 from entering our tissue. Therefore, it is important that we find a balance between omega 3 and omega 6. It is fair to say, the more omega 3 we have in our nutrition, the better our body can prevent inflammation. Flax seed oil was common in the region, and it also contains a lot of omega 3. But is difficult to store as it perishes

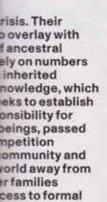


E is for Education

Industrial hemp has seen a steady rediscovery in past decades. Are we experiencing a breakthrough moment for this extremely versatile and sustainable crop? It needs little water, no pesticides, yet absorbs large amounts of carbon dioxide during growth, provides housing, medicine, textiles and jobs. Can hemp contribute to a system reset? German photographer and climate impact storyteller Maren Krings set out on a six-year journey to examine how hemp can help create circular economies. Krings has photographed more than 200 projects in 26 countries on four continents and interviewed more than 80 industry experts. H is for Hemp shows how various industries have changed to more sustainable versions already.

21 September, 2017

Johann Stötter from the University of Innsbruck called to ask whether I could make it to Schnalstal by 6 a.m. the following morning. I was in southern Piemonte, Italy, but yes, I could make it. Truth is, I had been waiting for this opportunity for weeks.

I drove almost 700 kilometers overnight to get there, while searching for my glacier equipment underneath everything else in the Caddy. What a hassle. I hadn't expected I would need to use the crampons, icepick, wool mittens and my down jacket while in Italy enjoying 30 degrees Celsius summer temperatures.

Tired but excited that I'd made it to Karthaus, I climbed into the helicopter with Hans (as I am privileged to call Prof. Stötter). The sound of the rotor blades beating the air and the downwash of air filled with dust and tiny stones made me wide awake again. I got to thinking about the years I worked with the Tyrol mountain rescue team in Westendorf.

The first flight transported us to the measuring station on the mountain. The pilot knew the exact location to drop us and the fixture for the station. We cleaned the snow and ice off the roof of the container that protects the brand-new Terrestrial Laser Scanner (TLS) installed on the border between Austria and Italy a year ago, part of an international project to accurately measure the real time changes on the glacier, documenting climate change and evaluating the impact of global warming.

"The more we know about the changes that are happening, the more precise the predictions of consortiums like the IPCC can be," said Hans as he fixed the metal screws with his bare fingers in -10 degrees Celsius.

It's unbelievable how much a glacier teaches us about the global climate. He gave me a lesson on albedo, the glacier's ability to reflect incoming radiation. When the ice is thick it reflects all light. Less ice means less surface reflection. Less reflection means a warming earth. He also talked about ablation and accumulation, which show the loss and gain of ice on a glacier, influencing our entire climate. M.K.
